Hope Extended Life-skills Program (HELP) now at BOCOH

In response to many community requests from parents of teens with autism and other developmental disabilities, the Center of Hope has established a special year-round program for youth. The Center's **Hope Extended Life-skills Program (HELP)** will offer an enrichment program for teenagers with autism and related disabilities (ages 14 - 18) **during non-school days** (holidays, institute days, spring break, summer vacation, etc).

The HELP Program offers parents a viable alternative to accessing care when their children have time off from school. Teens with autism and related disabilities do not transition well. Many have difficulty coping with change and get anxious if their daily routine is altered. Days off from school can be very stressful for the teens because their weekly routine has been disrupted. This stress can cause some teens to act out or withdraw; this in turn can cause great stress for the families as well. Some teens with autism also have intellectual limitations and learning problems.

Because they don't have the ability to express emotions like anger and frustration in more acceptable ways, they might express themselves in ways that seem inappropriate.

The HELP Program will offer a classroom alternative to help these students transition on days off as well as give parents an appropriate and safe setting for their children during these school holidays. Many schools in our community only have a short summer school period. The HELP classroom will be held year

round for a total of 71 non-school days.

Supports for families who face the extraordinary challenges of parenting a child with special needs are fundamental to family and child well being, and to healthy communities. Families who are in the work force and have teens that require out of school support are in a very different position from families with typical teens. Registration in advance is required and families will be asked to pay a portion of the cost of \$12.00 per hour, using a sliding fee scale based on family income. **Please contact Vickey Alexander at 815-964-9275 ext 233 for further information.**

OUR MISSION: Help individuals with developmental disabilities reach personal goals through individualized skill development, vocational opportunities and community service.



This has been an unprecedented year for everyone living in the Rock River Valley. Unemployment has risen to 20%, the highest we have seen even on a national level. At the Center, we have downsized by eliminating our satellite site and decreasing the hours and salaries of our employees. However, the need for our services has not decreased. In fact, we are currently looking at 8 new potential participants

and trying to figure out how we can make the necessary arrangements needed for enrollment at the Center. Many of these families have been waiting for our services for many years! How do we remodel a room to make it accessible for these families when the state refuses to pay us for services we have provided during the last 4 months? How are we supposed to pay our bills and make payroll? How do we keep telling our loyal employees to do more with less resources? They haven't had any increase in pay for over 3 years. Unfortunately, if you work for a non-profit in Illinois, this is your fate.

The ability to come to work every day is very important to our participants. Every challenge they undertake is done so with gusto, whether they are helping make our handmade dog biscuits, working in Super Shredders, cutting flowers in Moments or assembling and packaging in Hope Industries. No job is too big or too small. The frustration for participants and for us is not having enough work available for those who want to earn a paycheck. In our vocational training areas,

excitement can be felt when accomplishments are met as participants learn to use adaptive devices to control their wheelchairs, operate a blender or use a computer for the first time. Yes, at Barbara Olson Center of Hope, we celebrate both small and large accomplishments. Our frustration is not having enough equipment for everyone to have the opportunity to reach their individualized goals. We see those goals as significant steps in our participants' drive to reach their dreams.

Governor Quinn is threatening to further cut our services in order to reduce the horrible budget deficit. Yet, there doesn't seem to be a problem keeping open the big institutions that warehouse folks with disabilities and that cost the state and all of us taxpayers so much more money than community services. When will it stop?

When will the people and legislators in Illinois come together to make the kind of cuts that won't hurt people who are the most vulnerable, and have the most to lose? **Please, write to Governor Quinn at 207 Statehouse, Springfield, IL 62706**, and urge him to not cut funding to individuals with disabilities or any community human services provider. We at the Center know the value of jobs, both our own and the participants' "work". We just hope that the Governor doesn't take our participants' livelihood completely away, and we become another unemployment statistic in the Rock River Valley.

We have been so amazed and appreciative of all the support the Center has seen during this economic downturn. We can never thank our supporters enough for continuing to allow all our participants to dream their dreams. ♥

- Last summer, they again organized the Summer Bash party for participants and families on the grounds of the Center of Hope.

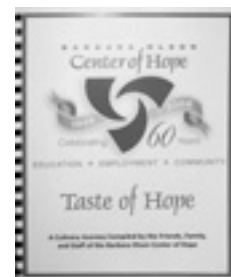

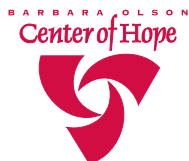
